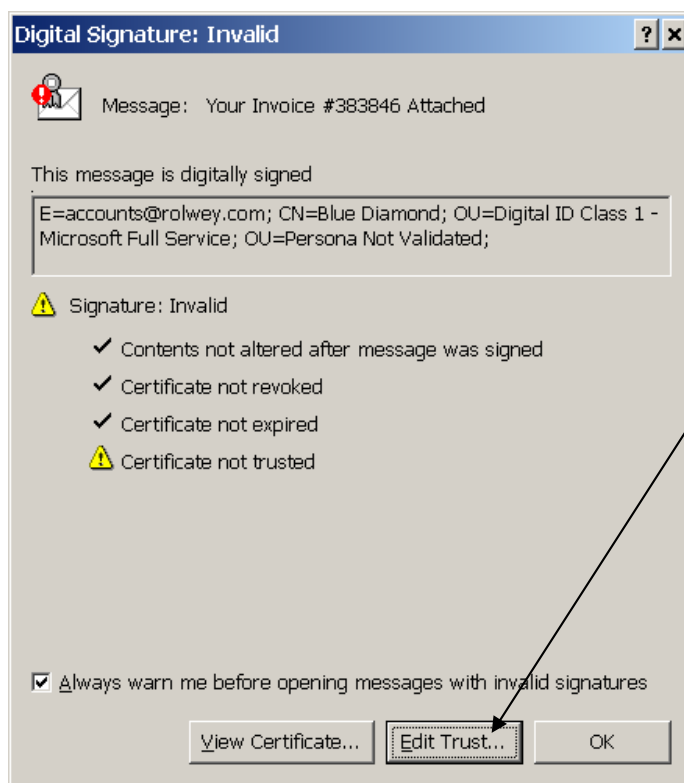
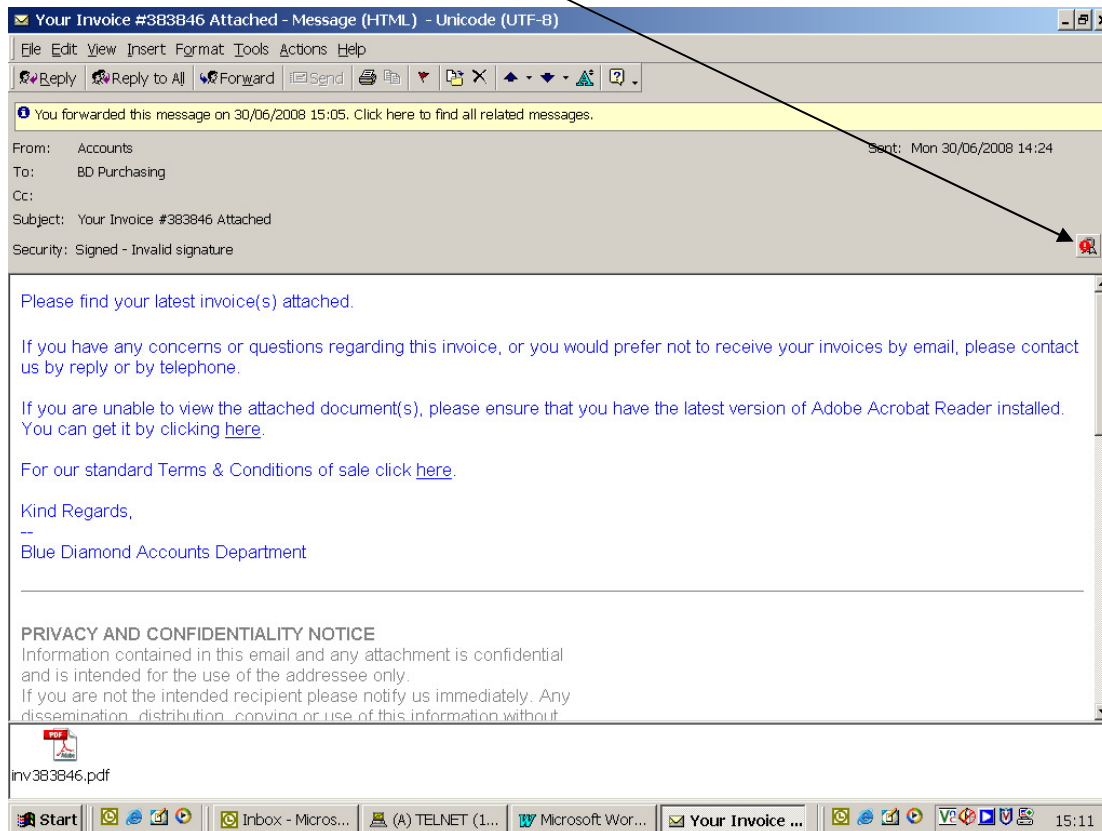



Open the e-mail you receive from blue diamond accounts.


